We should now be well into the warmer weather, summer officially begins on the 21<sup>st</sup> of this month though as I write this article in May I've got lots of layers and the heating on so who knows!

The 9<sup>th</sup> June is Whit Sunday or White Sunday, known as such because people being baptised on that day wore white clothes! The other name we use these days is Pentecost Sunday. It is the day when we celebrate God sending the Holy Spirit. The disciples gathered in the upper room and they were frightened about being caught by the authorities and being put to death like Jesus had been and confused by all that had happened since that first Easter Sunday.

All these events are recorded for us in the gospels and Acts. We also have Paul's letters in which he explains the gifts of the Spirit and how they are given so that we can share God's love with the world.

But what do you think of this Holy Spirit? Is it something you've thought of at all? The Church has been split about the way the Holy Spirit is experienced and how the Spirit works in us. For some it is a powerful, transformational experience; things like prophecy and healing. Others experience it as the quiet inner strength that gives them the strength to fulfil the commission to love others. The most effective way of expressing this is St Paul's first Letter to the Corinthians. 1 Corinthians 13:

"If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when completeness comes, what is in part disappears. When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put the ways of childhood behind me. For now, we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love."

So this Pentecost I wish you the power of the Holy Spirit; may you be loved and strengthened in order to love others.

In April I travelled to Nepal in a group of six to attempt to trek to Everest Base Camp. It was a challenge to myself, mainly because I am ancient, but also suffering as I do from vertigo (in the past I have been unable to negotiate York city walls) the terrain is scary. In the group were my daughter Kate and grand-daughter Meg and we were looked after by a Nepalese Sherpa guide and delightful porters. The paths were steep and very rough and the long suspension bridges were very wibbly-wobbly, but I managed until at an altitude of 4,350 metres, when breathing became laboured I let the young continue and I descended where the air suited me better. I was frequently asked my age by other trekkers who seemed surprised to see an old woman and then wanted to take a "selfie" with me. Overall It was an amazing experience and I feel very blessed. Many thanks to members of Alne and Tollerton churches who were kind enough to sponsor me with donations going towards Alne church heating. They, together with some friends in Easingwold, also gave me a fine collection of walking boots, socks, gloves and warm fleeces to take to the Sherpas who are often ill equipped.

I am a relative newcomer to the village having lived here only 18 months, but I have been informed the previous two Alne Open Gardens events were held on 21<sup>st</sup> July 1996 and 20<sup>th</sup> July 1997. So after a 22 year break, a renewed start to this English country village tradition of letting visitors wander around our lovely village and have the opportunity to view 10 beautiful local gardens, to see what lies behind the garden hedge.

We were fortunately blessed with a fine afternoon on Sunday, 19<sup>th</sup> May, and after all the preparations we waited to see if anyone would turn up! We sold 315 programmes to visit the gardens, which far surpassed our expectations, and I had to rapidly print off another batch to satisfy the high demand. There was a relaxed atmosphere as local people and visitors from far and wide started at the Village Hall, looking around the succession of varied gardens on offer, meeting the gardeners, asking questions and soaking up the atmosphere. Lots of positive feedback and complimentary comments were made on the day, as well as after the event.

The village was looking its best with the new kerbs and tarmac paths completed down the Main Street, verges cut, and gardens carefully tended. Live classical music, performed by Helen Dawson, Emma and Eve Hewison, in one of the gardens added a touch of culture to the proceedings.

As always with such community events, a big thank you goes to lots of people who helped to make it all work on the day. To all of the gardeners who bravely opened their gardens, the ladies of the Alne WI for the scrummy refreshments, Mike and Rosie Ness for transporting and setting up the Plant Fair, David Willis for producing the signs to promote the day, Dennis Myers for putting up direction signs and supervising the car park on the playing field, Angela Butler for running a secondhand bookstall and selling the programmes, and Jean for running the raffle. Apologies for anyone I have missed out of this role call.

The Open Garden participants had a chance for a tour around each other's gardens on the Monday evening. Over £1,500 was raised from just the Open Gardens to go towards the Village Hall funds. All the plants sold and the cakes and teas also sold out, making a good return for the WI. Everyone seemed to be happy and enjoyed this revived event.

As to the future, hopefully it will not be 22 years until the next event, but perhaps it should be every two years, rather than annually. There have been some useful constructive comments received, so we can improve things. If there is anything you would like to make us aware of, then please feedback any further comments to me, and once again a big thank you to all those involved on the day.
